



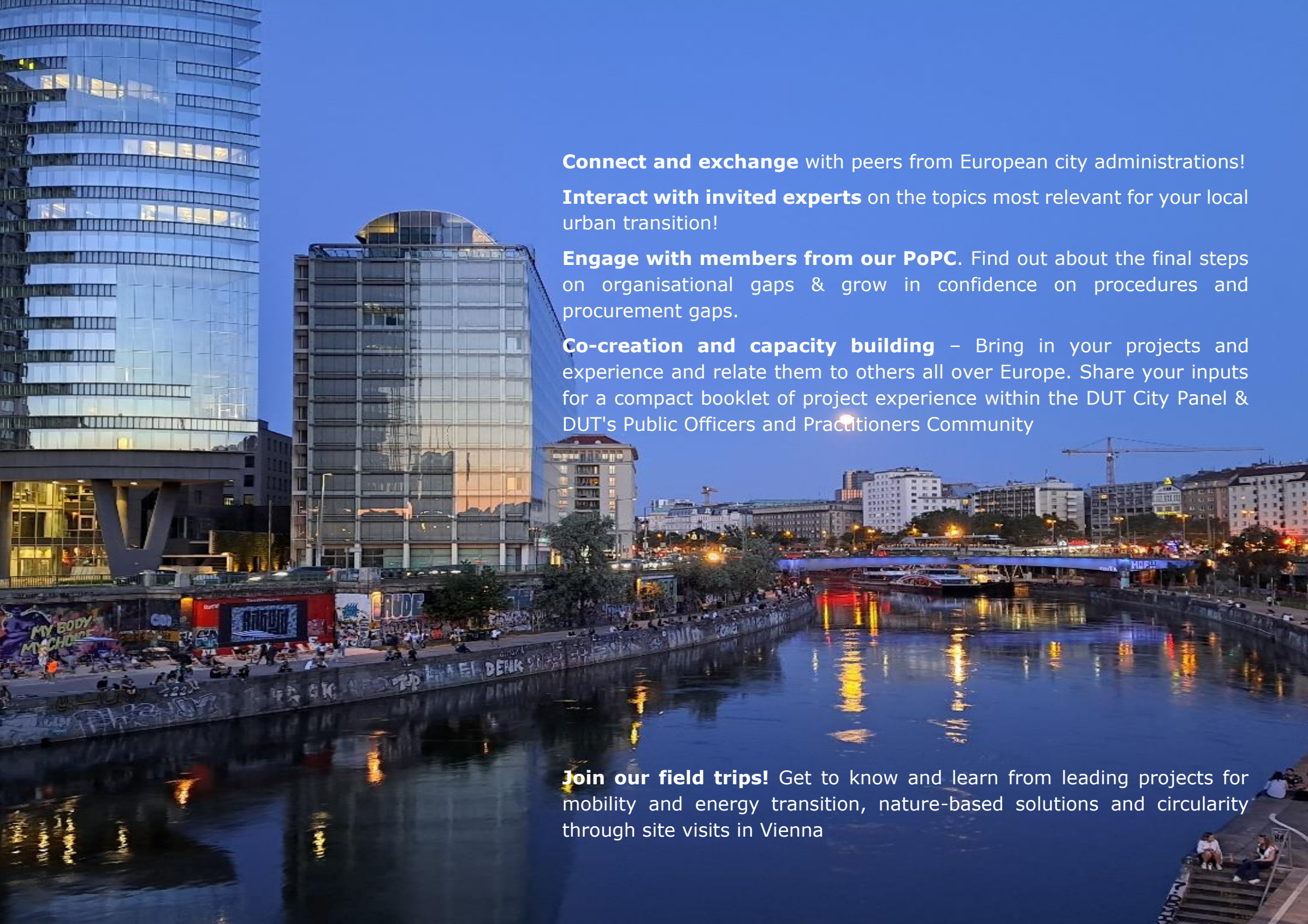

Arrival and Departure

- By Train

- By Plane

There are several ways to get to the city from Vienna-Schwechat (VIE) airport:

From the airport to the city centre:

- Public Transport

The cheapest way to get to the city is by public transport. Please use either the S-Bahn line **S7** or the **ÖBB Railjet**. A one-way ticket to and from the city (including inner district of Vienna) is €4.10. For further information on timetables, please visit

- City Airport Train (CAT)

The City Airport Train is the fastest way to get to the city. A single ticket will be €14,90, the return fare (both directions) € 24.90.

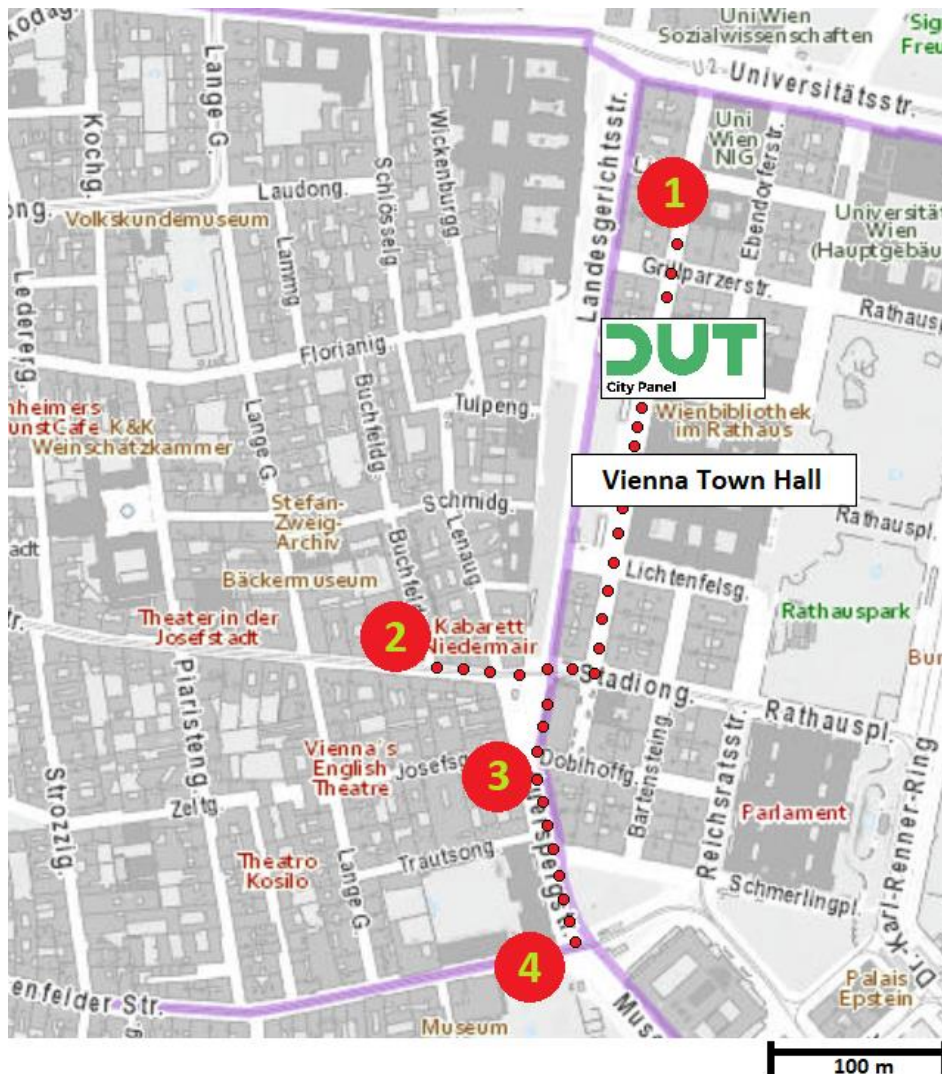
Public Transport Vienna

We generally recommend using public transport, which is very well developed in Vienna. Tickets are available from ticket machines at all stops and stations and online at

A single ticket costs €2.60 and a day ticket €8.00. The 48h ticket is particularly recommended, as we will be out and about in the city on both days of the event and you could also use this ticket already for arrival and departure.

Both venues are located in the city area and are easily accessible by public transport.

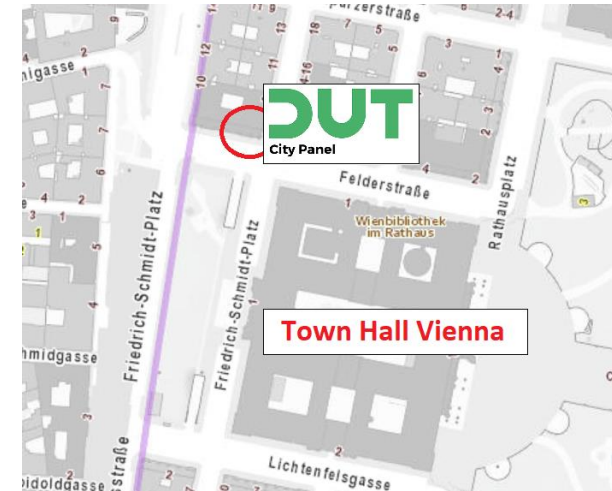
